- What is PSO?
 - Patient Safety Organization (PSO)
 - Patient Safety and Quality Improvement Act (PSQIA) of 2005
 - Framework for creation, operation, and legal protections.
 - Encourage reporting and learning from errors without fear of liability in support of Continuous Quality
 Improvement Programs
- Revelation Pharma national network of compounding pharmacies driving quality and industry excellence.
 - Quality Excellence > CQI
- Alliance for Patient Medication Safety (APMS)
 - APMS is a federally listed Patient Safety Organization (PSO)
 - Provides CQI Program

USE CASES

Meeting Regulatory Standards



- 22 States Require CQI Program
 - AL, AR, CA, CT, FL, IN, IA, KS, KY, MD, MA, MO, MT, NH, NC, ND, OK, OR, RI, VA, WV, WY *NABP 2024 Survey of Pharmacy Law
- Outsourcing facilities and cGMP standards
 - · Quality management and continuous improvement "inherent" cGMP principles
 - · Require systems for quality assurance (QMS), which include monitoring and evaluating drug quality, and compliance
 - "21 CFR 211.192 Investigations of discrepancies"
 - ICH Q10 Pharmaceutical Quality Systems
 - Investigation and Corrective Actions: Deviations, Non-conformances, out-of-specifications (OOS) results, implementing Corrective and Preventative Actions (CAPAs)
 - Lessons learned from CAPA activities, encouraging proactive identification and resolution of issues
 - Mitigation of risk (Quality-Related Events QRE) ICH Q9
 - addressing root causes and reoccurrences for sustained / effective quality outcomes
 - Complaint Handling customer complaints, adverse events, recalls

USE CASES

Achieving Accreditation Standards

- · Accreditation Commission for Healthcare (ACHC) Pharmacy Compounding Accreditation Board (PCAB).
- PCAB TCRX5-ALL: The pharmacy lacks evidence of a written, effective, ongoing performance improvement plan.
 Quarterly and Annual reports were not in evidence. Data is available but not analyzed effectively.
 - APMS PSO / CQI Program contains effective tools for assessments and trending data by period
 - Network pharmacy enrolled in APMS PSO, maintained CQI certification and received accreditation with POA
- National Boards of Pharmacy (NABP) Verified Pharmacy Program (VPP)
- 91.00 Reporting: Incidents of QREs are reported to a nationally recognized error reporting program, an outside peer review committee, or a patient safety organization. Indicate which organizations are reported including if the pharmacy reports QREs to the board of pharmacy.
 - Network pharmacy enrolled in APMS PSO, maintained CQI certification and adequately addressed inspection deficiencies
- · Joint Commission, Centers for Medicare & Medicaid Services (CMS) require quality improvement programs
